Thomas D. Hurst, age 66, passed away August 11, 2014 at his home after a valiant life with Multiple Sclerosis.

He graduated from Granite High School in SLC, UT. He attended Snow College, Ricks College, and the University of Utah receiving a B.S. in Business Marketing and an M.B.A. degree.
