Theresa Hadlock Larsen, loving wife, mother and grandmother, passed away peacefully at home on Sunday, Oct. 21, 2012. Theresa was born December 26, 1931 to Carl and Minerva Hadlock in Vernal Utah. She served a LDS Mission in Tonga, where she taught music, english and seminary at the Liahona College. She graduated from BYU receiving degrees in Music and English, and later received her teaching certificate for Learning Disabilities from Southern Utah University. She married Louis C. Larsen on September 23, 1963. She was an accomplished vocalist and pianist, utilizing her talents by serving extensively in church callings throughout her life for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, and in the communities in which she lived. She served as an ordinance worker at both the Jordan and Oquirrh Mountain Temples.
