Kenneth Lawrence Schoenrock, 64, passed away May 1, 2014 in Provo, Utah. He was born December 30, 1949 to Lawrence Arthur Schoenrock and Mary Bernice Jensen Schoenrock in North Hollywood, Ca. He attended Cohasset Street School, Lakeridge Jr. High School and graduated from Birmingham High School. He attended these schools in Van Nuys California where he grew up with his sister. He attended BYU in Manufacturing Engineering. He served an honorable mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints in the Central States Mission. Ken served six years in the Army National Guard. Ken was a master engineer. He could build or fix anything. He loved working with steel and worked the majority of his career at Valtek in Springville, Utah. He later started his own business, Alloy Machine Shop in Spanish Fork, Utah.
