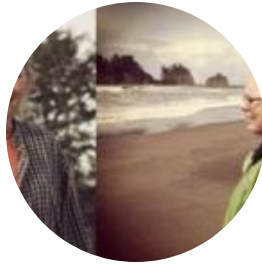

She obtained a master's degree in geography and directed BYU's International Cinema program, which was her passion.

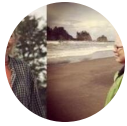
