Ray Lewis Farley, 59, of Orem passed away after a long illness on September 11, 2018 of heart failure. He was born in Provo, UT on September 28, 1958 to Lewis Blaine Farley and Norma Lorraine Ruffell. He grew up in the Orem and Provo areas and was the oldest of seven children. In 1976 he graduated high school from and proudly served his country in the Navy, aboard the USS Constellation. He married Nancy Wallace on April 25, 1981 and they had two children in the length of their short marriage.
