Steven Fred Painter, age 63, passed away peacefully in his home surrounded by loved ones on November 12, 2018 from cancer. He was born in Nephi, Utah on September 21, 1955 to Fred and Sadie Painter.

Steve is survived by his wife Karen Painter, his siblings; Gene Painter (Cheryl), Joyce McCaffery and Marion Lee (Charlotte) Greenhalgh.
