Marian Iona Bock Story Barney, 85, passed away October 28, 2019, surrounded by family. Jackie was born August 24, 1934, in Salt Lake City, Utah to William E. Bock, who immigrated from Germany, and Iona L. Hansen Bock. She was raised by her mother and Paul Whatcott. She was later known as Jackie Bock with her saggy socks. She was raised and schooled in Salt Lake City, Utah. Other cities where she moved to, were Pleasant Grove, Orem and then finally settling in Lake shore.

She married Dean William Story on May 11, 1951. They had one child Rick Story, born on November 11, 1951. Dean later died November 16, 1963. Jackie then married Lynn A. Barney on October 31, 1964. They had one child Caryn Barney born on June 9, 1965. Jackie also helped raise Lynn's five other children. Lynn Barney died June 1, 2015. Jackie never remarried.

Jackie was a faithful member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, she was married and sealed in the Temple. She enjoyed her Relief Society visiting teachers who would come to visit her every month.

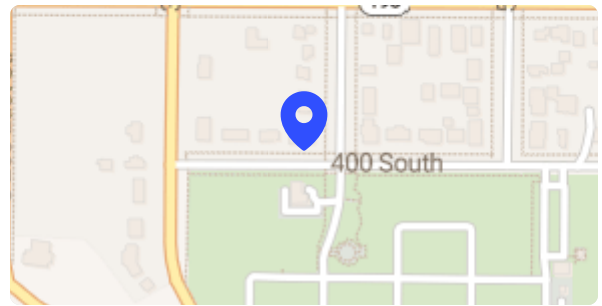
