Cynthia K. Payne, age 61, passed away peacefully November 6, 2020 following an early diagnosis of dementia 8 years previous.

"Cindy" was born in Salt Lake City, UT in 1959 and went with her family to California to live in Reseda and Thousand Oaks. Cindy was an active running enthusiast during the time in her young adult years. After her marriage to Robin in the Los Angeles Temple, Cindy moved to Jonesboro, Arkansas where she spent the next 29 years rearing a family and serving in various church callings for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints of which she was a devoted member.
