A Life Well Lived Jewelean “Granny” Brown September 14, 1942- February 11, 2022

On Friday, February 11, 2022, at 7:02 am while surrounded by her family, Jewelean Brown gained her wings and entered into eternal rest after accepting the call of her Heavenly Father. She was born in Hugo, Oklahoma on September 14, 1942 to the parents of Sam “Goings” Jones and Annie Jones. She was born the eighth (8th) of 12 children. She was raised in a Christian home and was taught the word of God and accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior at an early age. Her family later relocated to Edwardsville, Kansas.

In 1960, Jewelean graduated from Sunner High School and continued her education at Kansas State College in Pittsburg, Kansas studying Physical Education where she maintained academic excellence. 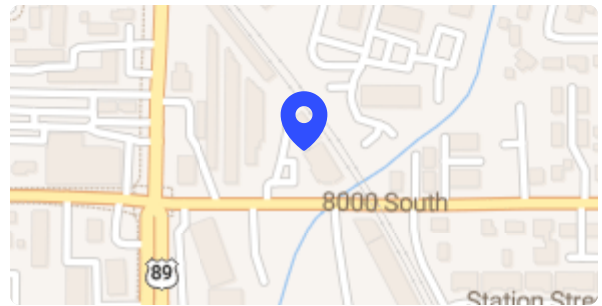

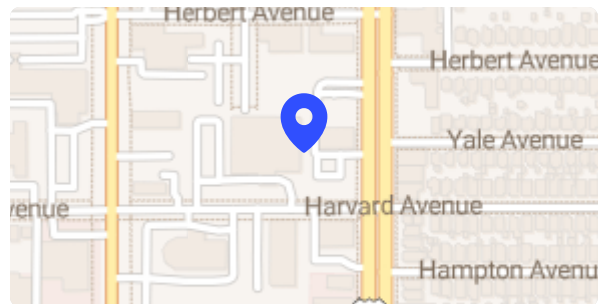

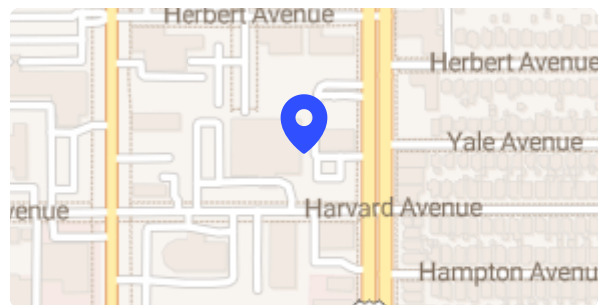
