Judith Elaine Cobabe Schneider passed from this life July 25, 2022, in Roy, Utah at age 76.

Remains will be interred in Green Hills Memorial Park, Rancho Palos Verdes, Los Angeles, California.







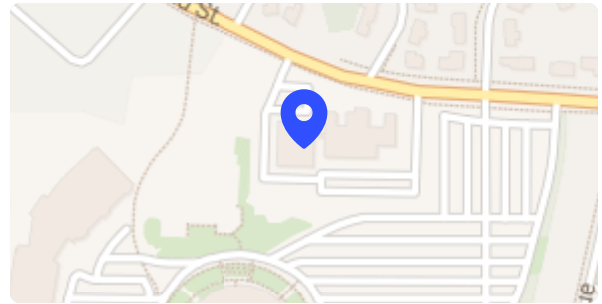
