In his youth, Brad discovered a love for music and began performing at an early age. He was very talented on the piano and as a singer. He began singing in the Show Choir while at Fairfax High School and also several other performing groups. Brad was also an avid athlete competing in basketball, football and Tae Kwon Do. Brad was a very talented martial artist and worked his way to a 2nd degree black belt. He later became both a state and national champion in the Junior Olympics. Through his love for football, he became a die hard Washington Redskins fan for life. Brad attended Brigham Young University after high school and relocated to Salt Lake City, Utah. After college he met and married Melanie Cox Aldous and had his first son, Kaden.

In his adult life, Brad rekindled his love of music, starting a long career as a professional DJ and Karaoke Host, where he shared his talents and encouraged many others to do the same. Brad later went on to become the Founder and Creator of Utah Idol, one of the largest and longest running talent competitions in the state of Utah.
