On October 5th, 1956 Sherman Clay was born to Clayton F. and Winnifred M. Bond. Clayton and Winnifred raised Sherman out in Bisti, NM for about 16 years before tragedy struck and burned their home and livelihood of a trading post down to the ground. Together the family of three moved their home permanently to Kirtland, NM and started anew. Sherman graduated from Kirtland Central Highschool in 1975. He lived a life filled with faith, love, laughter, and humor. He was a loving husband, a dotting father and grandfather, and a true friend to all who had the privilege of knowing him. He has touched the lives of countless individuals throughout his mortal journey with his great sense of humor and ability to make friends with any and all wherever he went.

It was when Sherman was about 5 years old when he came to know for himself and have a strong testimony that Joseph Smith Jr. was a true prophet. From there his love for his Savior Jesus Christ grew and helped him decide to serve a mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Little Rock Arkansas when he was 19 years old.

A graveside service will be held September 9, 2023.

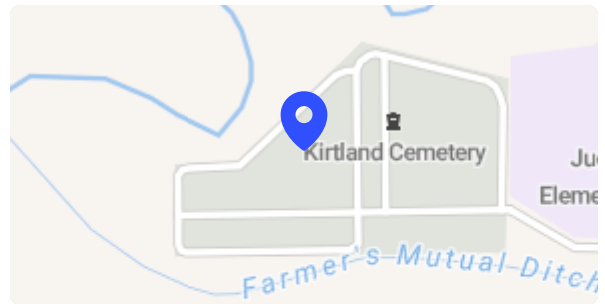
