On October 14, 2003 he married Claudia Woody and she died on November 21, 2010. He attended Ogden City Schools and was a member of the Ben Lomond High School football team. His favorite Clans, of course were Dance Clan and the “parking lot clan”. He later joined the U.S. Army. After his service he followed the example of his father and became a Boilermaker by trade. He retired from the International Brotherhood of Boilermakers Union 182.
