Phyllis lived in Great Falls until high school and then lived 2 years in Kalispell, Montana. She attended Ricks college and BYU where she met her husband, Bruce Elvin Kelly. They were married on November 21, 1975 in the Salt Lake Temple and lived all of their married lives here in Orem, Utah. They have 5 children, 19 grandchildren, and 3 great-grandchildren.

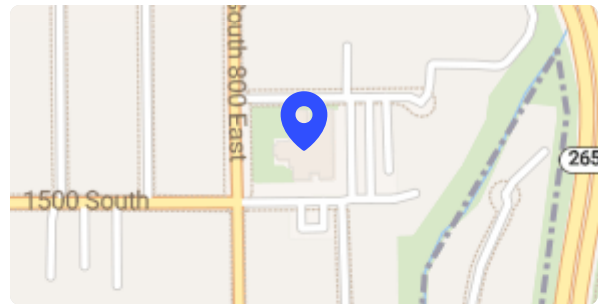

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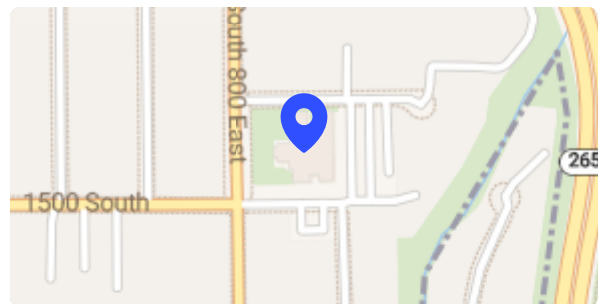

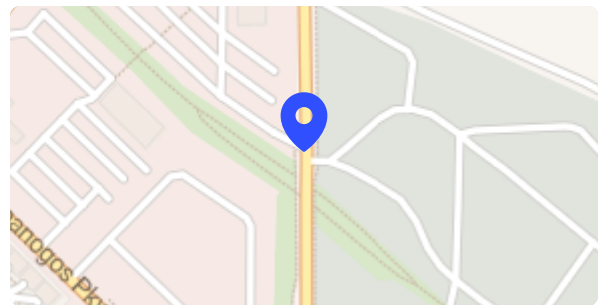
