Bradley Joe Heilesen, 54, of Idaho Falls, ID, passed away peacefully on June 22, 2024 surrounded by family and friends. Bradley Heilesen will be deeply missed and forever remembered.






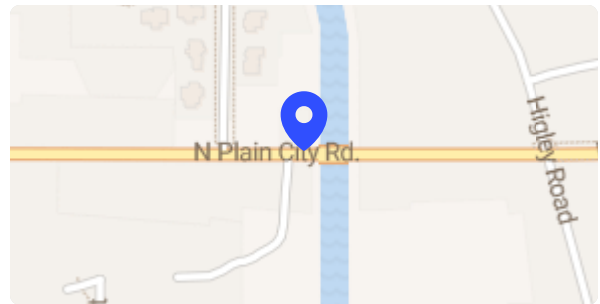

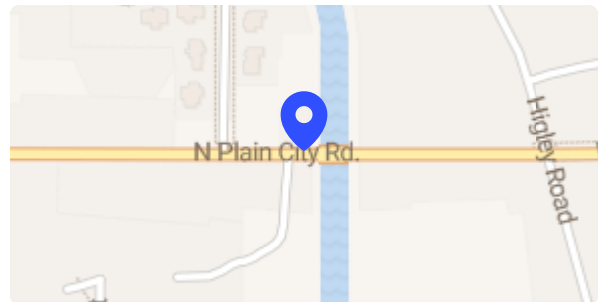

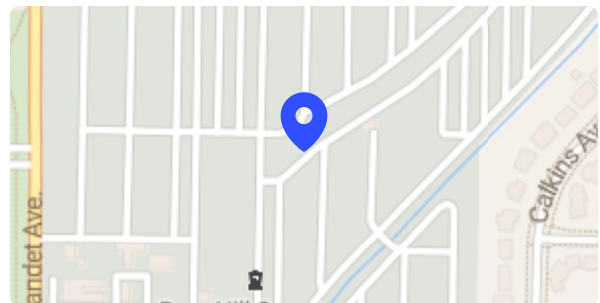
