Reed Meldrum Dahl, 97, of Morgan Utah, peacefully passed away September 26, 2024, at the Family Tree Assisted Living in Morgan Utah.

He was born on July 1, 1927, in Raymond Alberta Canada to Clifford Alfred Dahl and Ened Meldrum. He graduated from Raymond High School and went on to serve a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints in Ontario Canada. After his mission he received his bachelor's degree and teacher's certification from Brigham Young University. A few years later he received his master's degree.

He met the love of his life, Vivian May Zesiger, in Nampa Idaho and were married June 22, 1955, in the Idaho Falls Temple. They were married for 60 years when Vivian passed away Jan. 12, 2015. 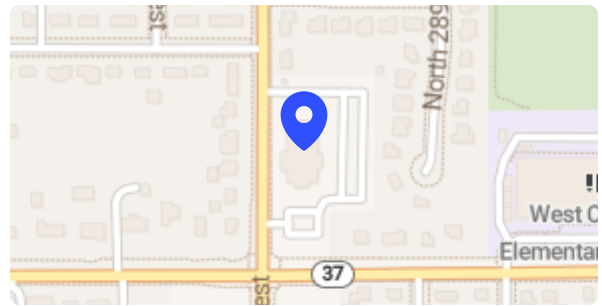

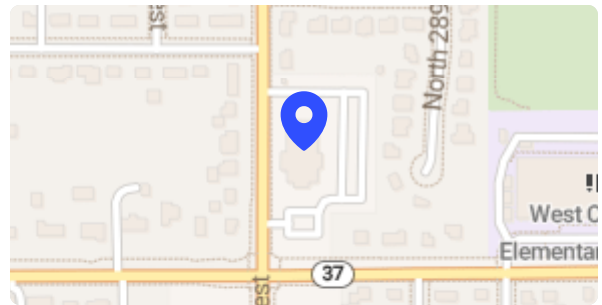

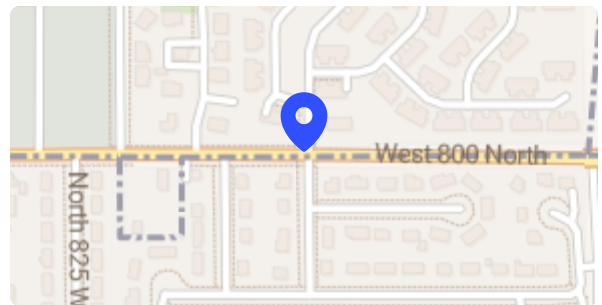
