Barbara peacefully passed away at Provo Rehab Center in the late evening of Friday January 2nd, 2026, at the age of 87.

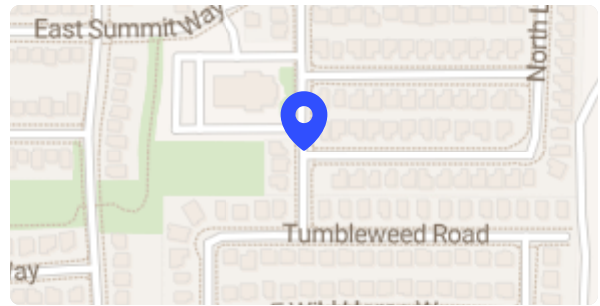
