Rex Albert Robison, age 77, of South Jordan, Utah, passed away on August 31, 2025. He was born on January 5, 1948, in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Rex graduated from Highland High School in 1966 and later attended Westminster College. On his twentieth birthday, January 5, 1968, he joined the Utah Air National Guard, where he proudly served for 28 years in the 40th AE Squadron, 939 Medical Squadron, in Portland, Oregon and retired as Chief Master Sargeant. Throughout his career, Rex also worked for Industrial Supply in Salt Lake City, Utah, as well as Industrial Supply Arizona. He completed his professional life as a supervisor with the Transportation Security Administration at Sky Harbor Airport in Arizona.
