Donna May Kunz Mackert, age 92, mother, grandmother, teacher, poet, historian, journalist, freelance editor, and author of 19 published books, passed away on January 11, 2022, in Eagle Mountain Utah.

She was born October 7, 1929, in Montpelier, Bear Lake County, Idaho, to Morris Quincy Kunz and Rhea Allred. She spent most of her life in Utah, graduating from Davis High School in 1947 and subsequently attending Weber College.

She is survived by over 150 descendants, including her nine children (Seth, Charlotte, Shem, Karen, Stephen, Kenneth, Mark, Maria, and Melanie), brothers and sisters, a large extended family, and her students.
