Sergeant First Class Guy Orville Gillett passed away Friday November 12th 2010 in Salt Lake City. Guy was the first of 6 children born to Orville and Ruth Gillett of Lehi UT. While living in NV he was reunited with his first love Darlene. They spent many wonderful years together and he lovingly took care of her until her death in 2008. Guy was a great man with a dry sense of humor. He was very proud and firm in his beliefs. He enjoyed doing many things but his passion was playing poker. He loved and cared for his family and was always there to lend a helping hand. Guy is loved and will be missed dearly by all who knew him!
