Kyle Ray Grant passed away peacefully on June 14th, at the age of 52, in his home surrounded by loved ones after a short battle with cancer.

To know Kyle... was to love Kyle, because just meeting him left an impression on your heart. Kyle was the most roll-with-the-flow, easy going, guy with the greatest sense of humor and quick wit. He truly understood that laughter is the best medicine. He kept us

laughing even up through the last moments of his life.

Kyle was an active member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. He served in many positions but his favorite was being a home teacher. Many were brought back to the fold through his love and Christ like example.

Some of Kyle's hobbies were listening to loud music, especially rock and roll, the louder the better. He loved working in his yard. He enjoyed the outdoors, especially a good hike. He was passionate about sports. Kyle was an avid BYU fan and loved the Utah Jazz during the Stockton to Malone years.
