She was known for her award winning chilli, baked beans, zucchini bread and homemade wheat bread. Her life dream was to own her own restaurant one day.

She is survived by her son Gary Dole (Stacy) in Pierre, SD, her daughter Rhonda Parkin (Mike) in Salt Lake City, UT, along with her 4 grandchildren: Brianna, Alissa, Alex and Tyler who were her pride and joy. She also had a special connection and love for her grand-puppy Cooper who brought a great deal of joy, laughter and puppy kisses to her

final days. She is also survived by her sister Stella Higinbotham in Iola, KS and her brother Dean Smoot in Vassar, KS,
