Born to Arthur Frederick Herbon Jr. and Mary Elizabeth Herbon, in Inglewood California September 22, 1959, Nancy spent her youth and most of her adult life in Southern California. At the age of 15 she joined "The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints" and committed herself to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
