She loved all of her grandsons so much and loved to be one of the boys including telling them jokes or words that they probably should only say at home. She was excited to challenge her boys in cornhole because she had been practicing at the Rocky Mountain Care Lodge in Heber and doing very well. She was always looking for a challenge, a game, some fun or stories and some good food. She always cheered us on and was on our side no matter what. She loved us unconditionally one and all.

She dearly loved dice and card games, bingo and lots of bling. She played 31, Uno, Skipbo, 10,000 Dice, Kings in the Corners, Scrabble, Chess and anything else anyone would ever play with her. She played Mario games on the early Nintendo and Wheel of Fortune. She won almost all the time at bingo and got her final 'Lights Out' 31 on her mother's birthday. Shelly loved to be glamorous and show off her beautiful bling bling. No matter what jewelry you were wearing, she commented on it and either wanted it or had something like it already. She left a lipstick kiss on everyone that was lucky enough to be close enough to her to get a big hug and kiss from her. She was always humming or softly singing random tunes as she always had a song in her heart. She loved to listen to beautiful singers and people playing instruments. Miss Shelly was all about her salsa and chips, pizza, chile verde, roasted jalapenos, and any hot and spicy Mexican food. She would say she was allergic to rice though, because she hated it so badly.

Shelly had strength beyond measure. When times got tough, she got tougher. She wouldn't let things beat her down because she knew she had to keep going. Her parents and grandparents taught her many values, ethics, and morals and she held her head high with pride, dignity, and grace as she ruled her kingdom throughout her short life. She passed on these teachings to her children and grandchildren. She always got glammed up and looked like a million bucks like royalty or a movie star. The brightest jewels she wore were her smile and the twinkle in her eyes.

Many of you who knew mom would say she always tried to prolong your departure because she just didn't want to see you leave. Her famous words were "before you go,". She loved to ride on a golf cart with her grandkids and raced her Jazzy cart down main street in Price UT, until the kind officer asked her to slow down a little. She was so lovable and to know her was to love her. Everyone that met her loved something about her and she loved something about them. Shelly and her family wish to thank her best caregivers, friends, and admin at Rocky Mountain Lodge in Heber, and all of her very special close friends in her ward and at Rocky Mountain. She loved attending her church services, taking sacrament and reading her scriptures.

Mom fought many illnesses in her life including cancer, kidney failure, and COVID-19. It took a triple whammy to take out this strong JUSTESEN woman. She passed in Davis Hospital while holding her stuffed elephant. She loved all animals as much or more than people sometimes. She rescued so many animals and people. All of her pets except her cat Bella Luce will be joining her in heaven. She will see Megan, Maggie Mae, Bornfree, Rukus, Bobbie, and many other animals of hers and ours. She mostly loved elephants and lions. She was so worried about why the elephants are dying off. It broke her heart.

Mom died at 81 years old and that was too soon, but it was time to release herself from her tired Earthly body. Mom was very mentally and physically strong to the very end of her Earthly life. She was always spiritual and researched and was 'saved' by many churches, but she finally achieved her sacred endowments in the LDS Mormon Temple in Provo, UT. It was an accomplishment she worked for and desired her entire life and her grandparents and family are so proud of. We are beyond blessed and grateful for the love, memories, teachings, and smiles that she gave us all.
