Stacy spent her earliest childhood years as the daughter of a marine and moved across the U.S. four times and then spent a year in Iwakuni, Japan. As a teenager, she was an avid reader, artistic, and loved being part of the yearbook team of which she was eventually chosen to be editor.

In 1986 the family moved back to Utah and the next year Stacy graduated from Bountiful High School. A few years later Stacy served a successful mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day saints in the Fort Lauderdale, Florida mission. After her mission, she worked as a caretaker for children with special needs.
